- 5. SCENE 5A "Next Big Thing" A scene filled with ambition and self-promotion; how do dance and costuming work together to showcase these themes?
- 6. **SCENE 6A & 6B "Batucada Fantastic"** A rhythm-driven scene exploring the global roots of chocolate production; how does cultural representation influence movement choices?
- 7. **SCENE 7A "Pure Imagination"** The grand finale; how does this final number tie together the visual, narrative, and movement themes?
